Keynote Performance

Workshop Title: “You Don’t Know Me Until You Know Me”

Presenter: Mykee Fowlin, PsyD

Description: In his one-man presentation, ‘You Don’t Know Me Until You Know Me’, Dr. Mykee Fowlin takes the audience on an experiential journey, having them reexamine core precepts that were taught to us from as early on as 1st grade. He uses many of his gifts – humor, performance art, poetry, storytelling, psychology, theatrical monologues, and his personal journey – to create a moving experience for all who are open to this evolution.

He encourages all age groups, from pre-teens to adults alike: “We are capable of transforming the world, for the good, but this work starts from within; it is the process of turning our hurt into self-reflection, healing, and then action. It is our simple, but intentional, behaviors where significant change takes place. The gesture of us smiling, acknowledging the existence of another, is as powerful as any other deed done in the world. Let us be like the oyster, turning our pain into something more valuable, but never forgetting the final piece in this transition. The value of the pearl takes place when someone else receives it, not if the oyster keeps it.”

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Workshop I

Workshop Title: Restorative Circles: Anti-Asian Hate During COVID

Description: This workshop from the Immigrant History Initiative will introduce educators to restorative circles as an anti-racist tool in the context of anti-Asian hate during the COVID-19 pandemic. Using IHI's restorative justice facilitation guide as an anchor point, this participatory workshop will model a full circle process, while giving participants opportunities to reflect with other educators about addressing racism in the school environment.

Workshop Title: Using SEL to Advance Equity and Improve Student Outcomes

Description: This workshop will discuss the critical role of Social and Emotional Learning (SEL) in creating safe and caring learning environments in the classroom. SEL teaches students and adults the emotional intelligence competencies they need to be more self aware, make good decisions, develop empathy, appreciate diverse perspectives, and improve the quality of their relationships. Especially in the current climate, SEL is vital to advance equity and improve student outcomes. The speaker will share her experience implementing SEL programs in schools across the country and give concrete research-based strategies for successful K-6 SEL classroom implementation.

Workshop Title: Mitigating Burnout Among Educators through Self-Compassion & Gratitude

Description: Working in a K-12 setting is already challenging and stressful, but the pandemic has exacerbated these challenges and stresses in the past two years. Educators are reporting higher levels of burnout. School districts are facing the challenge of staff shortages, which is causing educators and others to take on more responsibilities to meet the needs of their students. While educators are advised to alleviate burnout by practicing "self-care," like exercising, eating well, or getting a massage, we need to acknowledge that these self-care strategies have their limitations. In this webinar, attendees will be introduced to the concept and practice of self-compassion and gratitude and its impact on resilience. Attendees will also learn three methods of practicing self-compassion and gratitude to support their overall wellbeing.

Participants will also have the unique opportunity to listen to Kevin’s story. Kevin arrived in the United States at the age of five, speaking not one word of English. His narrative will focus on what helped, what didn’t help, and what would have helped, as he navigated his educational journey.
